Public elementary and junior high schools



- Public schools are free, but you will need to pay fees such as lunch, field trips, and school supplies.
- There is school lunch (給食) at public elementary/junior high schools. You can also apply to bring your own lunch.
- Consult school/Board of Education for allergies.
- If you need to move, you may need to change schools. Contact your school first.
- shugakuii kenko shindan iushin hyo ■ The city will send you "Medical Examination in Attending School" (就学時健康診断受診票) in September of the year before your child enters elementary school.*
- Your child will attend medical examination during Oct/Nov at the elementary school he/she is to enter. You will then receive "Letter of Admission"(入学通知書) in January. *
 - *Contact the city hall in case you do not receive these documents or letters.





About evacuation

Evacuation centers are opened by the Kamakura City. Anybody can go.

Assess whether you should go to an evacuation center. You may go before the situation worsens. Be warned that usual streets may become dangerous.

Think about various situations.

When you are at home, go to the nearest evacuation center. If you are at school or work, follow their evacuation rules. Schools usually provide guidlines for parents.


